PTO

Our next PTO meeting is February 13, from 1:30-2:30 in the large conference room here at Baxter School. Please join us if the meeting fits into your schedule. Also, please note that our March PTO meeting is not the second Tuesday (that falls during spring break) but instead is the first Tuesday. So, that meeting will be March 5th.

Attendance

We encourage parents/guardians to report absences online, for both prior and future absences. Parents/guardians can access attendance reporting through Skyward via the website, or, through the Skyward mobile app. To learn more about how to enter absences online, click here: Family Access Attendance Once attendance information has been submitted, please click 'save'. After you click 'save', a confirmation message will be sent to the parent/guardian email.

If you are calling Trisia in the front office regarding attendance and do not get an answer, please leave a voicemail with your child's name and the attendance information. Her voicemail messages go right to her email, so she will readily get that information and then she will enter the absence into Skyward.

End of the Day Pick Up or Changes

End of the day pick up information can be sent via Class DoJo to your child's homeroom teacher. Other changes regarding end of the day plans, such as ride the bus instead of getting picked up, etc., should also be sent to the homeroom teacher via Class DoJo.

We ask all people who are picking up at the end of the day to wait in the pick up line and not walk up to the front entrance for pick up. Even with our high numbers of pick ups, we are done between 3:05 and 3:10 on most days. Remember, we do not begin loading students until after the school day ends at 2:45.

Occasionally, a student has an appointment at the end of the day. In those rare instances, the guardian should call Trisia in the front office to explain the situation and that a pick up for an appointment is needed near the end of the day. We ask that all other people remain in the pick up line. For safe and secure pick up procedures, we cannot have people just walking up to the front doors to ask to pick up at the end of the day, because with the number of families who pick up, this would create chaos.

Dropping Off Items During the Day

If you need to drop off a forgotten lunch, snow boots, a classroom treat, or anything else during the school day, our process is that you bring it to the front office and leave it there for school staff to deliver. Unlike volunteering, which has you staying in the classroom for a planned event, dropping off items tends to be much more disruptive to the classroom and learning environment as teachers have to stop what they are doing to connect with whoever is showing up at the classroom and find out what is needed. For this reason, our process for dropping off items is that these get left in the office for school staff to deliver. We deliver these in a timely manner and with little to no disruption to the classroom.
